#### From the Pastor's Desk

April showers bring May flowers.

Most people are familiar with this saying, but I often wonder how true it is – especially here in NW Montana. It seems that our showers don't officially start till June!

It doesn't really matter, because the month of May is filled with the sounds of birds and the smell of fresh grass and flowers. The month marks the end of frosty nights and the growing anticipation of barbecue's, outdoor activities and the last days of school!

It is also the month that we take a day (the second Sunday) to celebrate our Moms!

But did you know that May is also the month of the following observances:

- \* National salad, barbecue, blood pressure, Hamburger and Older Americans month. All of these are observed all month long along with Foster care month and Date your Mate month.
- \* Weekly observances include: Nurse's first week, Wildflower second week, National Bike third week, National Police third week (I wonder how much publicity this one will get this year?), and Medical Emergency Medical Services week fourth week
- \* Day observances include: May Day, Loyalty day, Renewal day, National Missing Children's Day, Armed Forces Day, National Day of Prayer, and Memorial Day.

Instead of doing a specific "Mother's Day" article, I figured I would do one that could benefit us all, taken from a Scripture that is often overlooked.

Life tends to be a series of seasons. There are good seasons, and difficult seasons. Times when we are overwhelmingly happy, and times that we are so low, that we feel we could play handball off the curb!

It is often in times like these that we wonder about our purpose in life or even question it if we ever knew what it was.

As children, we often dream about what we want to be when we grow up (except for Bryce – who just wants to grow up!). When we were dreaming, it seemed we could do just about anything – and that is so true, but as we get older, we seem to start doubting the roles we are in. Questioning if we are where we're supposed to be.

Esther found herself in the same predicament.

Here we have a young girl who suddenly found herself in a role she never expected. She first finds favor with the king, then seems to have lost that favor.

And, at a most critical time, while feeling completely unqualified, she is called to something remarkable!

We sometimes feel that way, don't we? Think back to your first day of class in college, or your first job.

In Ester 3 and 4 Haman's conspiracy becomes known, and Ester agrees to help the Jews.

Verse 4:14 is a pivotal verse: "For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"

This is a question we should all ask. Perhaps this is the moment for which you have been created — this is God's purpose for you.

This encouraging truth is applicable in so many of our roles. It doesn't matter if you are a man or a woman, young or old, whenever we feel inadequate or unqualified, we must remember that God will prepare us and position us in the calling He has for our life.

He will also equip us with everything we need to fulfill the plan He has for us.

It sometimes seems that so much of our walk with God is spent in preparation and waiting. It might seem like we are stuck, not able to do anything. That our lone voice means very little.

And during these times, we often wonder what God has planned. We wonder if maybe God has forgotten us.

Can you imagine the thoughts of Esther? The fear of knowing what was coming down the pike?

We might wonder: Is my life leading to something great? Will I make it through another day? Why am I going through all of this? We must always remember that God has a purpose for us, and we are told that:" ... in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Rom 8:28).

He is working out details behind the scenes to prepare us for the calling He has for our lives.

So, when you are questioning Gods calling in your life, especially during the trying times, or even the dull, mundane times – remember these three truths from Esther's life:

- 1. You were CREATED by an awesome God for a powerful purpose.
- 2. You are CALLED to a very important assignment even if you don't realize what it is at the moment.
- 3. You have been CROWNED with God's favor for such a time as this.

We are here now, in this particular place and this particular time, to bring glory to God!

So, as the month opens before us – into wonderful possibilities – let's look for opportunities to Share Jesus Christ with our neighbors, and share the Peace of God, that Surpasses all understanding (Phil 4:6-7)!

The Lord has given us countless blessings, including the great gift of happiness and laughter, I try to be a "keg is half full" kind of guy, but there is still a lot of lost and hurting souls out there who don't know what true happiness feels like. Though we ourselves cannot save people, we have an almighty God who can, and guess who He uses to guide those people to Him. In my old age (compared to most toddlers, yes, I am old), about ninety-five percent of testimonies I've heard included somebody else witnessing to this new child of God, whether it be inviting them to church, praying with them, handing them a Bible, living out their faith in front of that individual, and the list goes on. To round out this month, we have officially finished our curriculum of Journey Through the New Testament, as we are now practicing our skits until the talent show which takes place on the 16<sup>th</sup> and will be going through a book in the Bible for summer group. Coming up the youth are going to be busier than a psychiatrist at a Timmerman family reunion, starting with handing out May Day baskets to different members of the congregation, on May Day, who woulda thunk. Big thank you to Karen Hartle and my beautiful wife Rachel for driving the kids around to drop off the flower baskets. The next day, on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, we will start selling tendollar tickets for the talent show, which will be their next event on May 16th. During the summer, between summer group, we have two camps, one at Flathead Lake July 5<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> and the other at the Spear O' Wigwam resort in Buffalo, WY, August 20th-23rd. Praise God for all these great activities we get to partake in! Confirmation ends on the 16th, and the kids are definitely ready to move onto year two, so definitely another praise to the Lord that we've been able to grow together through His perfect Word!

As always, thank you so much to the entire congregation and community for supporting these ministries, and not impeaching myself or the secretary, we thank you greatly.
