#### From the Pastor's Desk

Standing at the Crossroads Jeremiah 6:16

As we get ready to celebrate the birthday of our nation, we as a people need to make a choice. We can choose to follow the crowds and the ways of the world, or we can choose to stand firm and follow the ways of God!

God told Jeremiah in Jeremiah 6:16 - This is what the LORD says: "Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls.

Jeremiah recorded these words of God in about 620 BC. That was a full 20 years before Babylon took over Jerusalem.

God warned His people that if they do not heed the message, certain destruction will follow.

And, looking at the historical record, we know what happened - Babylon completely destroyed Jerusalem, and the people were carried off to captivity for 70 years.

At this point in time - Jerusalem was at a fork in the road. They had a decision to make. They could continue in the path they had been walking, or they could choose to turn aside to the path God had shown them.

Looking at where they had wandered, their situation was bleak.

They had forsaken God and were worshipping the pagan gods of the nations around them.

God said they were adulterers, giving themselves to the pagan temple prostitutes.

They were even sacrificing their children to these foreign gods in the hopes of receiving more stuff!

God said that their character was so far gone that they didn't even know how to blush anymore at the atrocities that were being done!

Their preachers proclaimed lies, and the leadership was ungodly, and the people not only accepted it, but embraced it!

So, God: ever merciful, and gracious, and loving, reaches out to His people through His Prophet and pleads for them to turn away from the path they were on.

He tells His people to stand in the way and see, or stand at the crossroads and look.

This literally means to stand at the intersection of the paths and look. This gives us the idea that as we stand at the intersection we get to look right or left and see what awaits us.

We see the old path that God Himself laid out for us, and we see the path that man has put in.

So, what path are we on? And this question is being presented to a people. God is not asking what path you are on personally, but what path is the nation on.

So, that begs the question - How are we doing as a Church?

Are we doing, ok? Sometimes I would say - Yes, we are doing ok, but then there are other times when I think that we aren't doing so well!

So - what do you think? And as you ponder that question, I want you to think about a few things:

The outstanding public debt as of 1 July, 2021 at about 11:15 AM was: \$28,334,679,892,640 That's 28 Trillion - with a T! That means each person's share of this debt is \$85,776.

It is estimated that 3,000 abortions are conducted daily, so it is estimated that there have been more than 62 million abortions since Roe Vs. Wade. And according to Barna Research - only about 9% of American Adults hold a Biblical World View.

Which means that only 9 percent of adults in America hold to Absolute truth, that the Bible is totally accurate, that Satan is real, that a person cannot earn their way into Heaven, that Jesus Christ lived a sinless life on earth; and that God is the allknowing, all-powerful creator of the world who still rules the universe today.

9 percent. That means that only 9 people out of one hundred believe these things! So, how are we doing as a Church?

If the mission of the Church is to make Disciples, and only 9 people per 100 have a Christian world view - How do you think we are doing?

God established the nation of Israel, and He wanted to lead them in one direction and one direction only - toward Himself. But the Jews were not content with only following the Lord. They began to worship in what were called the high places. There they would offer worship and sacrifices to pagan gods, the gods of this world.

I am sure at first these pagan practices seemed harmless to the Israelites. Compromise usually starts small, but it started them down the wrong path. There is a saying which goes "when you choose a path, choose it carefully, because eventually you come to the end of it, and the end isn't always pretty." In Jeremiah's time the Jews had come to the end of the path and judgment was coming!

The verse goes on to tell us that after we look at the paths presented to us - we are to step out on the path that God has given us - and WALK in it!

So often, we as a Church oscillate between decisions, and go back and forth trying to decide what to do. We seem to stand in the intersection afraid to step out. It seems the Israelites suffered from the same hesitation.

We as a Church need to check the path we are on, ensuring we are following the Word of God, then we need to step out in Faith!

And notice the results of this: you find rest for your souls!

For those who take the good way, the ancient path, the way trodden by those who have been faithful through the years, there is a promise of rest.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 11:29 - "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

The old way isn't the popular way! It is being abandoned daily by people who have decided that new is better. They are leaving the Bible, worship of the Lord, and Biblical Teaching.

The enemy is active and prowling, tossing out new and different ideas - that are neither new nor different!

We as a Church need to be on the lookout! We stand at the crossroads.

Are we seeking the ancient ways? The Good ways? And are we walking in them? Because there is where we will find Peace for our souls!
