From the Pastor's Desk

Are we in a Spiritual War?

With all the issues facing us today (COVID, Vaccines, Defunding the Police, Violence in cities etc.) many people have asked me - "Are we in the end times?"

I usually answer with an affirmative answer. Yes, we are in the end times, and Jesus will return soon!

I think that is the same thoughts that the Apostles had. And as we look at all the troubles around us, I am reminded what Jesus tells us in Luke (21:34) But watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day come upon you suddenly like a trap.

We need to be alert and doing the work our Father has set before us - specifically building the Kingdom, and know that bad stuff does indeed happen in the world around us.

With that in mind - we also need to be aware that we are indeed in a war. A spiritual war!

Sometimes it is hard to truly comprehend a threat that comes from things that are unseen. But God warns us that spiritual warfare is very real and to arm ourselves with what He has given us. He tells us:

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. (Ephesians 6:12)

For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ (2 Corinthians 10:3-5)

Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. (1 Peter 5:8)

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. (James 4:7)

There are two primary errors when it comes to spiritual warfare. Over-emphasis and under-emphasis. Some blame every sin, every conflict, and every problem on demons that need to be cast out.

Others completely ignore the spiritual realm and the fact that the Bible tells us our battle is against spiritual powers.

The key to successful spiritual warfare is finding the biblical balance. Jesus sometimes cast demons out of people; other times He healed people with no mention of the demonic. Paul instructs Christians to wage war against the sin in themselves (Romans 6) and warns us to oppose the schemes of the devil (Ephesians 6:10-18).

So - how do we fight in this war that is waging all around us? We put on the Whole Armor of God as found in Ephesians 6:13-18.

We are to stand firm with the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, the sword of the Spirit, and by praying in the Spirit.

Think of putting on the armor as a checklist or a reminder. Putting on the armor accomplishes two things:

It reminds you of what you need to do to be successful. It reminds you of Scriptures that you can recite, during the day, as needed.

Reciting, believing and obeying Scripture results in the supernatural power you need to be successful.

Putting on the armor doesn't magically protect you. And the name of Jesus is not a magic incantation that causes demons to flee from before us. The seven sons of Sceva are an example of what can happen when people presume an authority they have not been given (Acts 19:13-16). Even Michael the archangel did not rebuke Satan in his own power but said, "The Lord rebuke you!" (Jude 1:9). When we start talking to the devil, we run the risk of

being led astray as Eve was (Genesis 3:1-7). Our focus should be on God, not demons; we speak to Him, not them.

So, here are some suggestions when putting on the Armor of God.

First, Buckling the belt of truth about you. Here are some truths: God loves me {Romans 8:38}, I have a sound mind {2 Timothy 1:7, No weapon that is formed against you will succeed {Isaiah 54:17}, I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. {Philippians 4:13}, greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world. {1 John 4:4}.

Second, the breastplate of righteousness. Here are some things to help with this: I will set nothing wicked before my eyes {Psalm 101:3}, Love your enemies and pray for them. {Matthew 5:44}, Take every thought captive {2 Corinthians 10:5}.

Third, fit your feet with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. This Scripture "refers to a believer's stability or surefootedness from the gospel which gives him peace so he can stand in the battle. Some Scripture to build on: God has given me everything I need to live a godly life {2 Peter 1:3}, God has given me peace {John 14:27}, Trust and obey, pray without ceasing. {1 Thessalonians 5:17}, Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid {John 14:27}, Fix your thoughts on Jesus {Hebrews 12:2}.

Fourth, the shield of faith with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one: Be anxious for nothing {Philippians 4:6}, Trust in Him at all times {Psalm 62:8}, Be strong and courageous {Joshua 1:9}, Whenever I am afraid, I will trust in You {Psalm 56:3}, For we live by faith, not by sight {2 Corinthians 5:7}, The Lord is for me; I will not fear {Psalm 118:6}.

Fifth, the helmet of salvation: put on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet, the hope of salvation. {1 Thessalonians 5:8}, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right . . . dwell on these things {Philippians 4:8}, I will praise You, O Lord, with my whole heart . . . I will be glad and rejoice in You {Psalm 9:1}.

Sixth, the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God: Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. {1 Thessalonians 5:16-18}, Be on the alert, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong {1 Corinthians 16:13}, Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray {James 5:13}.

Finally, pray. Prayer is essential. Pray, in faith, without doubting when you come under spiritual attacks. Get into the habit of bringing all your problems to God. Get into the habit of coming back to prayer, from time to time, during the day. And remember, prayer is always a two-way conversation — be sure to listen when you pray.

So that's it. The battleground is primarily in our minds. The idea is to base our thoughts and behavior on Scripture—not on how we're feeling. If we go by our feelings, we will be defeated.

Ephesians 6 makes it possible for us to understand the spiritual battle we are in—and win. It makes it possible for us to experience the blessings of God—rather than the torment of the devil.

Remember - One of the Devils favorite tactics is to tell us lies and to speak them so convincingly that we hold them for the truth. One of Satan's strategies is to present us with a worst-case scenario of our future in order to arouse fear in us. He can take advantage of our vulnerabilities and circumstances, and even use people to make us worry, instill hopelessness, and rob us of joy.

The enemy will use anything and anyone to steal, kill, and destroy you (John 10:10). The enemy will even use the people closest to you. But God has given you armor to help defend yourself. We, as children of God, cannot go into war alone, just as an army does not go to the front lines alone. So, we need to make use of what God has given us in battle. After all, God is our strength and shield of protection (Psalm 28:7). He will never leave nor forsake us (Deuteronomy 31:6).

In summary, what are the keys to success in spiritual warfare?

We rely on God's power, not our own. We put on the whole armor of God. We draw on the power of Scripture—the Word of God is the Spirit's sword. We pray in perseverance and holiness, making our appeal to God. We stand firm (Ephesians 6:13-14); we submit to God; we resist the devil's work (James 4:7), knowing that the Lord of hosts is our protector. "Truly he is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress; I will never be shaken" (Psalm 62:2).

September Featured Recipe:

OLD FASHIONED RICE PUDDING

1 Cup Long Grain White Rice
1 Cup Chopped Walnuts
2 ¹/₄ Cup Milk
3 ¹/₂ or 3 ³/₄ oz. Package Regular
Cook Vanilla Pudding
3 TBSP Sugar
3 ¹/₂ Cup Water
1 ¹/₂ tsp Cinnamon
¹/₂ Cup Raisins
³/₄ tsp Vanilla

In large saucepan, combine rice, water, walnuts and cinnamon. Bring to a boil. Cover; reduce heat and simmer 20 minutes or until rice is tender. Sprinkle pudding mix and raisins over rice. Gradually add milk, cook until mixture just comes to a boil, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and stir in sugar and vanilla. Serve warm or chilled.

Building Committee Report

Our (3 year) Certificate of Subdivision Approval (COSA) expires September 24, 2021. This means all site development work (grading, drywells and surface stormwater catch management ponds) must be completed by that date or we will be required to submit a request to DEQ for a new COSA, which would be a costly and time consuming process. There are no extensions allowed! It does not require us to have paving done by that date! Our contractors are aware of this deadline and have agreed it should not be a problem completing required work by September 24.

In the meantime, our civil engineer Stephanie Reynolds (WGM Group) is modifying the site plan to include grading and paving around the church to the East side. DEQ said this is acceptable although it would require a COSA rewrite to change the gravel surfacing in the original approved COSA to paved surfacing and add in some stormwater features like drywells to manage the runoff from the 2-year storm event. The DEQ re-write process will take approximately 2 months for review and approval before the parking lot could be paved.

Carpet tile for the classrooms and wall carpet for the activity center has been ordered. The cabinet sinks in the classrooms are now operational and additional soundboards are under construction and hopefully will be installed before the Harvest Fest on October 10. There is also a plan to install white boards in the classrooms.

The kitchen drywall installation has been completed and the tape, texture, and painting should be done next week. There is a plan to install FRP panels on the walls and Ken West will be laying the floor. The roll-up door for the serving counter has been ordered. The worktables are being constructed and the cabinets will be purchased or constructed as well. Gayle Lantto and the WMF ladies have identified needed appliances for the kitchen. They have put much thought into cost, efficiency, and quality of these items. Josh Haynes a member of the congregation and cabinet maker is building the worktables and some of the cabinetry. Gayle, Josh, Matt, and others have met numerous times to go over the details for the kitchen. Thanks to Gayle for taking the lead on this matter!

Blinds will be ordered for all windows except the kitchen and the two in the activity center. The hot water heater and water softener has been installed and is operational. Work has begun on the North columns for the portico drive-thru. Many thanks to Rick Martinez for installing snow breaks on the upper roof. Pastor Craig is developing an AV plan for the activity center. Although it is not always obvious much work continues toward completion of the building project. As of this writing the building fund balance is \$224,559.90.
