## From the Pastor's Desk

#### Peace on Earth -- REALLY??

As we prepare and get ready to celebrate Christmas this year, there is A LOT of uncertainty and even fear! The economy is in shambles. We are told that gifts and other supplies are going to be in short supply, because of a broken supply chain. There are terrible reports of violence and rioting from cities across the country.

And let's not forget the pandemic - as if the media would allow that! It seems there is talk of shutting the country down again because of the OMICRON variant.

That's all we need is more fear and uncertainty!

It almost feels like a physical oppression that is pushing us to our limits, and the joy that is usually associated with Christmas feels dampened, and actually even depressing!

With all this going on, I think we have allowed ourselves to be lured into having a sense of doom and gloom and thinking that the future is just going to get worse!

So, whatever seems to be going on, or the reasons you attach to it, it seems that this year has less joy displayed, and a lot more stress.

And with the headlines we read in the news today, it almost makes the Angels Announcement of "Peace on Earth and, goodwill toward men!" sound kind of hollow.

I mean there hasn't been peace on earth since the Great flood!

And, looking at those headlines again and it seems that we have completely misunderstood the idea of Goodwill Toward Men!

As I write this article, and contemplate having goodwill toward others, I think one of the reasons we are struggling is because we are more focused on our will, than the will of God!

So, what do we do to remedy this? How are we to have joy with all the turmoil going on around us?

Well, we take a moment and look at what the announcement really is all about!

The Angel said: Behold, I bring you good news of a great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

First, notice that this news is for all people!

Too often we think that there are some who just don't deserve to hear about the Savior. And if we go down that road, we will very quickly see that we fall into that category ourselves, so we can help spread peace and Joy by spreading the Gospel message that Jesus came so we may have life and have it abundantly. # December Featured Recipe:

# OLIVE GARDEN ZUPPA TOSCANA II

- 1 lb. Italian Sausage
- 1 Large Onion, Chopped
- 2 Large Russet Baking Potatoes, sliced in half, then into ¼ inch slices
- 2 Cans Chicken Broth
- 1 qt. Water
- ½ tsp Fennel (optional)

- 2 Cloves Minced Garlic
- ½ Can Oscar Meyer Real Bacon Bits (less fatty than real bacon
- Salt & Pepper to Taste
- 2 Cups Chopped Kale or Swiss Chard
- 1 Cup Heavy Whipping Cream

Cook sausage in a 300° oven. Bake approximately ½ hour. Drain on paper towels and cut into slices. Place onions, potatoes, chicken broth, water, fennel and garlic in pot; cook on medium heat until potatoes are done. Add sausage, bacon, salt & pepper; simmer for another 10 minutes. Turn to low heat; add kale and cream. Heat through and serve.

I would be writing this in swim trunks and sunscreen due to how crazy nice it's been outside recently, but Craig says "that's not work attire", so instead I'm typing this newsletter in my khakis and red tee looking like Jake from State Farm, but happy December! The Lord has truly blessed us with such beautiful weather, and though the weather out here changes its mind more than I do picking out candy, our omniscient God never changes, another absolute blessing! If I'm being honest, these last two months (this is your Nov-cember newsletter, since we didn't get one out last month) have been full of ups and downs, which makes me even more thankful that we serve a never-changing Savior. No matter what is going on, our God is always the same, He will not let us down or leave us, it is not possible in His nature. # Building Committee Report

Matt did <u>not</u> include appliances in his \$ 50,000. estimate for the kitchen. With Gayle Lantto's leadership and the help of other kitchen ladies the appliances were identified and ordered. These have been purchased through Advanced Restaurant Supply except for the two ranges which were purchased at Home Depot. Advanced Restaurant will be delivering their equipment next Thursday December 9 after Ken West has completed laying the floor. The ranges have already been delivered.

If anyone would like to donate toward the cost of kitchen appliances following is a list of these. Please mark your gift "For Kitchen Appliances." It will go into the building fund but will help to offset what will be spent for these items.

The drive-thru pad has been concreted and Matt plans to build the roof structure in the months ahead as he has time and material becomes available. The storm water ponds were recently sodded, and the shed has been moved to allow better access beside the Northeast pond. Also, a water bottle filler has been installed above the water fountain outside the restrooms. *Good News looking ahead!* Both Matt and Josh (cabinetmaker) have committed to having the kitchen ready for use by Christmas. Thanks to Early McWhorter for arranging to get the rocks set at the East entryway. This is the beginning of her landscaping plan for around our new building, including the church.
