January Featured Recipe:



Cooking Oil Garlic Fresh Ginger Root 2 Cups Pork, Chicken or Shrimp 1 Cup Celery or Cabbage 6-8 Mushrooms 6 Green Onions ½ White Onion 6 Water Chestnuts Cups Fresh Bean Sprouts
 TBSP Soy Sauce
 TBSP Molasses
 TBSP Brown Sugar
 tsp Chinese 5 Spice Powder
 TBSP Cornstarch, dissolved in 4 TBSP water
 Wonton Wrappers

Finely chop garlic, ginger root, pork, celery, mushrooms, onions, water chestnuts and bean sprouts. Use more, less or omit items as desired. Prepare all ingredients. Heat a small amount of oil in large pan or wok over medium-high heat. Add garlic and ginger root in pan for flavor—remove and toss. Cook meat, stirring frequently. Either add 5 spice powder to meat or dissolve with cornstarch when adding sauce. Add remaining chopped ingredients in order. Combine soy sauce, molasses, sugar, spice powder, cornstarch and water. Add to mixture until thickened and thoroughly combined, but do not overcook. Allow mixture to cool before assembling wontons. Fry wontons in hot oil until browned.

Happy new year everybody, one of my resolutions for this year was to make my newsletters longer, so buckle up, this is the only one I haven't broken yet (which is kind of sad because I'm technically still writing this in 2021). Ok, I won't actually make them longer, I don't know if there's enough trees around to cover all that paper, but I do want to talk about the idea of being made new to go along with the new year. What is the first thing that comes to your mind when you think of the word restored? Maybe if you're a car person, the first thing you think of is something vintage or classic, like a '63 corvette or a moldy green '95 Kutlass Oldsmobile (that was my first car, but I'm not biased, most people would've put that on the list). If you're computer's always broken, like mine and Craig's, maybe you think of a software restoration. Jokes aside though, what really is the first thing we should think of when we hear that word? What makes us restored, who restores us? For the last two years I have been serving as Devotional Life Secretary on the FLY committee, (FLY stands for Free Lutheran Youth, we're not an airplane company), and our job is to plan the FLY convention, our Association's big youth camp every other year in Estes Park, Colorado at the YMCA of the Rockies. Unfortunately, this last year (2021) was supposed to be the summer of our camp, and we were forced to postpone due to cooties/covid restrictions. Our theme for 2021's convention, which we started planning in 2019, before any of this covid stuff had even come up, was Restored. God's plan is so great, and surpasses all worldly understanding, that we named it Restored before we even knew there was going to be a major necessity for a national restoration. The theme verse that goes along with the name is found in Revelation 21:5-7 and reads, "And he who was seated on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.' ⁶ And he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment. ⁷ The one who conquers will have this heritage, and I will be his God and he will be my son'." Verse five hits it on the head when Jesus tells us that He is making all things new. As we head into a new year, it's easy to get caught up in the "new year new me" and "I'm seriously going to change" slogans, and there's nothing wrong with eating healthier or less screen time, those of course are good things. However, the most important restoration that we always need to be going through, is through Jesus, our Savior. He restored us when we came to Him, like He told Nicodemus, we are born again, we are new! We are also constantly restored when we lay down our sins before Jesus with a heart of repentance and contrition. When we seek forgiveness from Him, He restores us. If we are truly walking with Him, we are living under His restoration, and that is such an awesome covenant. Let me step off of my pulpit now, throw on some sweats, and get my youth pastor hat on, here's what's new!

There has also been lots of restoration going on in youth group, both spiritually and physically! We have been diving into the book of John head over sheepskin sandals, learning about John the Baptist paving the way for the ultimate restoration to take place, the Gospel coming to atone for our sins. We have also tried to restore the carpet in the youth room several times, but all the ground in cheese balls and loose push pins give it character (and also encourage people not to walk barefoot like hippies). In the month of December, we hosted regular 87 unleaded youth group, a three week fundraiser, a Christmas party, and a Christmas program! The youth all baked cookies for our cookie trays December 1st at youth group, and did a phenomenal job, I had to get all their autographs before the Food Network signed them. We then sold those cookies and many more that the congregation generously donated, the 5th-19th, and raised a total of \$578.22! Thank you to everybody who donated cookies and bought cookie trays, it really was like the entire congregation, so thank you all so, so much! December 15th was our end of the year youth group Christmas party, and we had 18 in attendance, though it kind of felt like 81, but in a good way! They played games, built/demolished gingerbread houses, had a gift exchange with their secret santas, and most importantly discussed what the true meaning of this holiday is! The other major event was our Sunday School Christmas program: Chris-Myth Busters. Eleven Sunday school students took part in the program and did a wonderful job memorizing all of their lines and portraying the reason for the season! They all played their parts well, and brought many tears out, I of course was just sweating from my eyes, but other people were crying, I'm sure. Youth group resumes on January 5th, after Christmas break, and confirmation resumes January 9th. If you are youth group age, or know of anyone who is, come find me, I'm not going anywhere, I'd love to have a talk with you/them and get them involved!

As I watch the different ministries here at Stillwater, it is definitely plain to see that there are people praying for them. Praying for the participants, the leaders, and the church as a whole, and I want to thank/encourage all those who do keep us in their prayer lives and walk with Jesus. Building Committee Report

Proposed 2022 Project Plan

- Complete the kitchen including all electrical, plumbing and trim-out Note: Plumbing is included in Matt's \$ 50K estimate, but <u>not</u> KEI electrical.
- Contact state and county for Health and Building Inspections before we can apply for Full Occupancy Permit. We are operating under a Partial Occupancy Permit now.
- Continue work on North Drive-Thru roof structure Note: Matt's estimate of \$ 45K includes concrete pad, but <u>not</u> KEI electrical
- Install carpet tile in classrooms Ken hopes to begin installation soon. (Paid in Full)
- Install folding door in classrooms. (Need Estimate)
- Install wall carpet in activity center/gym. (Donated)
- Finish the floor at the North entry-way. (Estimate \$ 1K)
- Approve and implement Pastor's AV Plan for installation in activity center Note: Council has agreed to pay this expense from the Memorial Fund, <u>not</u> Building Fund.
- Install Fire Alarm System
 Note: Two estimates received to date each is approximately \$10K.

- Develop a plan for improving acoustics in activity center.
 Note: Two estimates received to date each is approximately \$20K.
- Review and update Matt's estimate for constructing Patio Roof.
- Revisit plan and cost for paving parking lot.
 Note: Donor said first estimate of \$ 252K is too costly.
- Continue landscaping around our new building and extended property.
- Develop a plan for installing a lighted programmable sign along Church Drive South of new building. (Need Estimate)

Naming our new building will be on the agenda for the annual congregation meeting on January 23rd.

Pray that God will continue to bless our project with another successful year as we move closer toward completion. Additional fundraising will be required if we expect to complete the tasks listed above as our building fund is fast being depleted.
