To go off that light topic though, I feel that a lot of us have had that phrase on our mind as of late, "what can I give?" or "what can I do?" Fourteen people were in attendance, a few adults, but mostly youth, and we played everything from basketball to volleyball to dodgeball to "who brought an inhaler, I didn't realize I was this old". Praise God for the ability to host something like that and be able to invite the community; this new building is a huge blessing! The next day, February 12th to be exact, the youth volunteered at the church for seven hours preparing for our annual Valentines dinner fundraiser! A total of eight youth were able to make and serve the dinner as well as play Jeopardy, and host a silent and live auction for all those who were able to attend. Around thirty people came out to support us at the dinner itself, and sixteen different families generously donated items for our live and silent auction, which counted for over half of our donations. So a huge, ginormous thank you to everyone who came out to support the youth group and to everyone who donated their time, money, and items for the auction and fundraiser itself! In total, the youth raised \$1,455, which is only a couple hundred shy of last year's dinner where we had exactly twice as many in attendance,

God is so good! In terms of upcoming events, the youth have their annual lock-in on Friday, March 4th, so please keep everyone in your prayers, especially for those who have to convince seventh grade boys that axe body spray is not an acceptable substitute for a shower. The church is also hosting their next open gym the next Friday on March 11th, and all are welcome, even if you don't play sports, the Minnesota Vikings would still hire you! As the new month kicks off and we continue to march (heehee see what I did there) through winter, we remember that as a new season comes upon us physically, a new season can come upon us spiritually as well! Building Committee Report

Much of the information in this report was presented to the church council on February 17. Contractor's work is now completed in the kitchen apart from installing the top cover on the roll-up door. This cover is on order. I spoke with Jesse M. Green, RS, M. ED, Registered Sanitarian at Flathead County Health Department on March 7, and he said we do <u>not</u> need an inspection of the kitchen. It would be a rare occasion that we might have restrictions of some sort and if we have questions contact them. The dishwasher was operationally checked by Mike, Advanced Restaurant technician and in fact has been used by Bryce after the Valentine's Day dinner and the WMF Pancake Breakfast on March 6. Gayle Lantto has been leading the effort to furnish the kitchen. Most of the dishes, silverware, and other items have been moved from the basement kitchen to the activity center kitchen. Please contact Gayle as to kitchen needs.

Ken West has completed installation of wall carpet in the gymnasium. Thanks Ken – excellent job! Ken has also completed half of the floor at the North entryway. The SE classroom has been setup for Wednesday evening Kids Club, the After School Program and Friday Fellowship Time. Please use <u>only</u> dry erase markers on the whiteboard. Thanks to Rick and Judy Karboski for installing this board. The plan is to setup the SW classroom in the same manner. The tables and chairs should remain in these rooms. If they need to be used elsewhere, please ensure they are returned to the classrooms. Eventually we hope to furnish all rooms in the activity center so it will not be necessary to move tables and chairs back and forth from the church. There should be sufficient chairs and tables in the storage room to accommodate large activities such as wedding receptions, congregation dinners and the like.

Matt hopes to resume work on the North Drive-Thru in the Spring as he can fit it into his present workload. Depending on available funds we also hope to install a fire alarm system. We are also reviewing a plan to improve acoustics in the activity center gymnasium. The wall carpet has helped but we will need to do more like add more soundboards and/or acoustical tile, especially on the ceiling.

God continues to bless this project in so many ways and we give thanks for those that provide support with their prayers and gifts which keep us moving forward. As of this writing the Building Fund balance is \$ 80,471.07. Approximately \$ 40K of this is allocated to Matt's remaining work to complete the North Drive-Thru Portico. This does not include Kalispell Electric estimate of \$ 5K for their part of this project phase. I am expecting Trent Neumann's estimate soon for completing the groundwork for burying the roof gutter drain lines, installing the drywell, and finishing the ditch along the North property line. I am also expecting Matt's estimate before the end of the month for constructing the roof over the patio.
