## From the Pastor's Desk

The Transfer

Sherri and I sometimes watch the TV crime drama Law and Order. In this series, there is a fairly common theme where someone commits a crime (of course) and a family member or close friend confesses to doing it.

In this scenario, an innocent person with a good name, volunteers to take the place of the person who committed the crime.

Immediately, In the eyes of the law, all guilt and forthcoming punishment was placed on the one who confessed, and their total innocence was given to the one who was really guilty.

The guilt of the crime was transferred.

Did they deserve it? No!

Quite simply, the choice was made because of their love for the other. They did not want to see the person suffer.

Help was given, when no help was deserved, or really even asked for.

The Bible says, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends." (John 15:13).

This transfer of guilt for innocence, shame for honor, punishment for freedom, and yes - death for life is the most magnificent expression of love known to mankind.

And here's the greatest news of all - We are all beneficiaries of this great transfer!!!!

That's what Easter is all about! Showing us that God did indeed accept the transfer!

And here's something to think about:

When the Creator of all things, past, present, and future made the decision to rescue us - fallen mankind - He knew that there was only one sacrifice that would make the great transfer possible, His Son, His only Son Jesus.

God's love for us compelled Him to take action when we could not help ourselves. It is written,

For God loved the world so much that he gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16).

The Bible tells us how that when Jesus was on trial, the crowd was given a choice to either let Him go free or the worst criminal & rebel Barabbas. They chose Barabbas, a man guilty of many crimes to go free. # Building Committee Report

Matt has resumed work on the north drive-thru portico and, as of this report, it is well on the way to completion. I hope to have Matt's estimate next week for constructing the patio roof, and we hope he can begin work on that soon thereafter. As for landscaping, Early will return June 20 and at that time she will place and seal the boulders. She said we should feel free to plant whatever we like at the entrances. I suggest the trustees/council develop a plan for landscaping the church property! In relation to that there are several piles of dirt that need to be removed, but for now we need to keep the topsoil.

### **Activity Center Acoustics**

Several members of the congregation have said we should make this a priority with our project. I have been researching this subject for quite some time along with two local sound engineers. They both agree by adding 4' x 8' sound panels on each side of the 16 ceiling lights will make a significant improvement in the acoustics. I have been collaborating with a company in Tampa Florida (AcoustiMac) that makes these panels, excellent quality and just what we need. Customer reviews give them a Five Star rating for their products and services. Our cost for the 32 panels is \$ 10K. Matt's estimate to install them is \$ 8K. This is \$ 7K less than the first estimate we received. We have the funds! We will have samples of the core material and fabric in the church office very soon. The recommendation is to go with Khaki 2 as the fabric color as it will be a good contrast to the beams in the activity center.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support and as always please contact me with questions or concerns relating to the overall project.
