From the Pastor's Desk

With my mouth I will give thanks abundantly to the LORD; And in the midst of many I will praise Him. Psalm 109:30

Does it seem to you that the Thanksgiving holiday has lost its significance over the last 10 years?

It seems like it has become less and less about what we are thankful for, and more and more an opportunity to eat and watch football.

Now there is absolutely nothing wrong with the eating part, and football is ok (unless of course if you are a Minnesota Vikings or a Pittsburgh Steelers fan – then it's just wrong!), but seriously, the whole point is to take a day out of the normal hustle and bustle of our lives and be Thankful for the blessings we have in our lives. More specifically we are to be thankful for the Blessings God has given us!

Did you know that the Bible uses the word "Thankful" or "Thanksgiving" over 100 times. And in almost all of those instances we are encouraged to give thanks to God for the multitude of blessings He has given us!

There is a song in our hymnal called Count Your Blessings (#575) and the words are tremendous:

Are you ever burdened with a load of care?

Does the cross seem heavy you are called to bear?

Count your many blessings, ev'ry doubt will fly,

And you will be singing as the days go by.

What a wonderful reminder to take the time to think about what God is doing for us. Too often we focus just on the horrid things – the devastation of natural disasters, the trials of the economy, the evil of the world.

But take time every day to verbalize or write all you are thankful for. You may want to use this outline. Doing so will revitalize your soul.

Begin With Thanksgiving. Psalm 100:4 tells us, "Enter into His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise."

Thank Him for His patience and forgiveness.

Thank Him for the privilege of coming into His presence.

Thank Him for what He has done in and through your life in the last year.

List What He Has Done. Take time to list what God has done for you. Be specific. Think through every area of your life.

And then:

Become Still Before the Lord (Psalm 46:10).

Consider who God is (Psalm 103).

Praise Him for His attributes (Psalm 145).

Rejoice in your fellowship with Him and that He delights in you (Proverbs 15:8).

Read passages of scripture and pray them back to God (Psalms 146-150).

How many gifts have you given in the past that have left you with a sense of emptiness because you never heard back if the gift was appreciated or not?

Jesus asked, in Luke 17:17-18 'Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?'"

How many times have you received a gift and neglected to let the giver know how much you appreciated it?

How often do we take all the blessings and gifts from the Lord for granted — we almost feel entitled to them. Far too many times.

As a final thought – as we give thanks to God for ALL our blessings – Lets be sure to thank Him again and again for the best gift of all – the Gift of His Son Jesus who gave His all for us, so we could become Children of the Father!

Hit #4 With COVID we take a hit – no longer the convenience of a bus drop off. The attendance was such that our van could do the pickups. How does it continue to run is a God thing for those of us who have the opportunity to drive it from time to time.

When she leaves Sherri takes it on and then hands off to Ashley in May of 2022. Another home run has been the fiscal responsibility there. The kids no longer pay "per day." Families pay for the month so our teacher, vehicle, snacks, etc. can be covered. It was operating in the red for the first 4 years.

Stillwater family, Thanks so much for your support of this ministry. I started with the World Series. Our after-school program is impacting our world in a serious way. We can love on those precious boys and girls who have come and gone through our doors since 2017. I stand in awe
