From the Pastor's Desk

Peace on Earth?? Good will toward Men???

December Featured Recipe:

<u> Vorwegian krumkake</u>

½ Cup Butter

1 Cup Sugar

2 Eggs

1 Cup Milk

1½ Cups Flour

½-1 tsp Cardamom

½ tsp Vanilla

Cream together butter and sugar. Mix in eggs with a spoon. Add milk, flour, cardamom and vanilla; mix well. Heat a krumkake iron. Put 1 tablespoon batter on the grill and close the lid. Remove from iron when ivory-beige in color. Roll onto cone while still hot. Continue with remaining batter. Eat them plain or as ice cream cones. May dip in chocolate or fill with whipped cream or pudding.

Note: This is a delicate waffle cookie enjoyed by generations of Norwegians. It is a popular treat at Christmastime. May also be made using an Italian pizzelle maker.

Building Committee Report

Work has begun on the construction of the patio roof and Matt hopes to complete this phase of the project in the next few months, weather permitting. He said his estimate of \$ 100K should be close for completing this last phase of the building project. Some material costs have increased, some have stayed about the same and a few have actually decreased in recent months. I met with him and Mark Van Derveer (Kalispell Electric) recently to review their plans and estimates. Mark said Jeff Timlick's estimate of \$ 5K for the patio should cover the electrical work. Together with Pastor Craig we are meeting with Matt to review plans for installing a large screen television in the activity center. Matt will be constructing the protective closure for the TV like the one at our sister church Faith Lutheran in town. The subject of installing a large digital clock in the activity center which was presented at last month's council meeting will be revisited after the first of the year. Mark has agreed to install the power requirements.
