From the Pastor's Desk

Here we are May already! How many of you are ready for Summer?? I know I am! Sherri and I didn't get to take our trip to California last month, so we are planning on going camping this next weekend!!! It will be our first-time camping in Glacier Park. We figured, since we live here, we should spend at least one weekend there O.

As we get into May, the first thing most of us think about, besides flowers, is Mother's Day.

Mother's Day is celebrated in many parts of the world, most commonly in the months of March or May.

Our version of the holiday began in the early 20th century at the initiative of Anna Jarvis, who organized the first Mother's Day service of worship and celebration at Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, West Virginia. The church serves as the International Mother's Day Shrine – something I didn't know even existed!

Interestingly, Mother's Day has been criticized for having become too commercialized. Jarvis herself, who began the celebration as a liturgical observance, regretted this commercialism and expressed that this was never her intention. She even spent the latter part of her life trying to remove it from the calendar.

Mother's Day is a day to honor moms. Clearly a good thing. Honoring parents is not only biblical, it's one of the 10 laws God gave to us.

Interestingly, have you ever noticed the influence mothers have on their children's lives?

When a football player waves to the camera, he always says, "Hi Mom!" Dad may have taught him to play football, but mom is the big number.

Moms give unselfishly, and sometimes go without themselves so that their families don't. They seem to have enormous amounts of time and energy to make sure that all are provided for and that the children are brought up correctly.

Mothers also teach us:

* about foresight: "Make sure you wear clean underwear in case you're in an accident."

* about logic: "If you fall out of that tree and break your neck, don't come crying to me."

* about religion: "You better pray that comes out of the carpet."

* about time travel: "If you don't straighten up, I'm going to knock you into the middle of next week!"

* They even teach us about the circle of life: "I brought you into this world, and I can take you out."

Mothers are our first teachers, and what they teach is of immense value! Mothers teach us morals, values, and above all else, Mothers teach us about having a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Paul tells us in his second letter to Timothy that mothers teach us about faith.

Paul says: (2 Tim 1:5) I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well.

Paul is telling Timothy that He thanks God, night and day, whenever he thinks of him and is reminded of his great faith.

But this faith that is seen in Timothy was first seen in His Grand Mother Lois, and Mother Eunice!

And how did they teach him?

They taught him by living their faith!

When we live our lives in faith – others see it, and you parents know – children are always watching. They seem to see and hear EVERYTHING!!!!

Someone once said: A Christian mother's most vital task is passing the faith on, not only by what she SAYS, but by what she IS!

Mothers always seem to have the best interests of their children at heart – don't they! They always want the best for them – even when it seems otherwise! G. Campbell Morgan, a British preacher whose four sons all became pastors, influenced millions with his preaching, teaching, and writing.

One day, when his young son Howard finished preaching, a reporter asked him, "Since you have five Pastors in your family who is the greatest preacher?

Expecting the son to give the honor to his father, Howard surprised the reporter by saying, "My Mother!"

Often people do not realize that a mother's love, concern, and teaching are often far more influential on people than anything else, yet we see in Scripture that Moms are some of the most influential people in the world!

The Youth are committed to serve the community through our strength in Jesus Christ.

We are only one week away from one of my favorite days/holidays – "May the Cinco de Mayo be with you", (I think that's right), so it must be May! I would explain that joke for those who didn't get it, but I don't really understand it either (I combined May the Fourth be with you and Cinco de Mayo). Charlotte's getting to the age where she has to explain her jokes to me because they're a little above my head, so now I'm in the joke explaining habit. Lately, I have been thinking a lot about being spread too thin, which normally just makes me hungry for buttered toast, but is a very relevant topic today, and the way that the Holy Spirit laid this on my heart, I do not think I'm alone in this struggle. Being stretched out or just simply exhausted can stem from lots of things – you have trouble saying no to things, you take on more than you think you can handle, your current life situation is just hectic, etc. I could go on with that list for a long time, and everyone's problems are individualistic to an extent, but the root is still there, "I feel like I have more than I can handle". Speaking first to the problem of struggling saying no or biting off more than you can chew, Jesus has a very wise insight in Matthew chapter 5. Jesus is giving the sermon on the mount, and is this particular passage, He is preaching about oaths. Jesus is warning about the danger of "false oaths" or "empty words" and in verse 37 He sums up His entire point, "Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this comes from evil." He is telling the disciples and others around that they should not have to swear an oath, their words themselves, even as simple as yes and no, should be believable without an oath. So, if you're one who struggles with taking on too much and saying no to things, remember that your word is your truth. We should always remember that as Christians because we should be speaking THE Truth, but this same ideology applies here as well. Do not answer before thinking, or consulting with those it might affect, and if the answer is yes, stick to your word not only for your sake, but for the ultimate Savior whom you represent. Lastly, maybe your situation is the latter of which I described earlier, where life is just hectic, you didn't even necessarily choose it, it's just a situation that you're in. These are the scenarios where anger and frustration often arise because it doesn't make sense, and in modern day terms, it's just not fair. These situations are where I do my best to remember and meditate on 1 Corinthians 10:13, "No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it." In this passage, Paul is specifically talking about temptation, but this is still applicable in times of exhaustion. When we feel too stretched or burned, like I just mentioned, more often than not, there are feelings of anger, but that is also a temptation. God does not give us more than we can bear, and He always provides a way out, that way out is Him. Maybe none of this applies to you at your stage in life right now, but this simple message should

 God is always the answer, and He is never-changing. Cast your worries and cares upon Him, that is where true relief is.

In terms of the youth group, things have been pretty quiet this past month, and I honestly think that is the first time I've used youth group and quiet in the same sentence. Through the month of April, we've averaged 10 students, with lots of new faces! One of my favorite parts of youth ministry is forgetting names, and not because I don't like remembering things, but that means there's new people to memorize, always a blessing! During this month, we also had six youth help serve Easter brunch after Easter service, I know, crazy time to do it. It has definitely been a blessing to see more youth involved with church itself lately, and a thank you to the congregation for encouraging our young people and allowing them to be a part of this awesome church body! We also have youth selling concessions and participating at the 4v4 "Senders Basketball Tournament"! At the time I'm typing this, it has not taken place yet, so I'll just put a place holder sentence in for now. The tournament went very well, money was raised, youth helped out, and people played basketball! Our last school year youth group will be June 7th and that will bridge us into summer group. During summer group, we meet once every other week and participate in different activities such as paintball, hiking, camping, swimming, extinguishing small grass fires when we forget to put out the campfire, fun stuff like that. 

Women of Faith Study Guide Series, <u>Cultivating Contentment, Managing Our Moods, A</u> <u>Life of Worship, and Encouraging One Another,</u> are titles of four separate study guides, good for individual reflection and growth, or as small group study. Another book that was donated anonymously is <u>The Brown Bag</u> by Jerry Marshall Jordan which is full of sermons for children.

Baxter Family Firstborn Series by Karen Kingsbury

This is a five-book series about family, hope, forgiveness, and how God leads in all situations.

Building Project Report

The following is a revised version of the report I presented to the church council on April 20. The council voted not to replace the sidewalk around the church. I plan to present a proposal for a fire/burglar alarm system at the May 18 council meeting.

LAST PHASE OF OUR BUILDING PROJECT

- Paint Patio Cover (Hagestad Estimate \$ 7,388.00) Retainer Fee \$ 1,477.60. Paid. Balance Due \$ 5,910.40 (Signed Contract) Paint underside - Stain and seal logs and beams. Also reseal North and East entrance logs and beams.
- Wiring and installation of patio lights (Kalispell Electric Estimate \$ 5,000.00)
- Install rain gutters and downspouts on Patio Cover (Gurgis Gutters Estimate \$ 1,346.) Signed Contract. Trent Neumann will connect the downspouts to underground drain lines and NW drywell as he did on the North and East sides of the building. (Estimate \$ 8,000.00)
- Construct concrete (flash barrier) wall around transformer (Matt's Estimate \$ 1,850.00) Required by State Fire Code.
- LHC estimate for paving the parking lot is \$ 115,224.00. The contract was signed by Darryl and approved by the council in September 2022. This includes paving around the church, the area between the buildings up to Church Drive and north and west to Lone Coyote Trail Road. The road to the west will be 18 ft. wide allowing for two vehicles to pass. A culvert will be installed on the west end onto Lone Coyote Trail Road. LHC said it will probably be June at the earliest before they can start on our project.

Thank you, Michael Meyer and Ann Martinson, for helping serve and Heather Meyer for helping cook and roll the burritos.


