From the Pastor's Desk

Most of you know that Sherri and I had a pretty trying year, beginning last November. It seemed that nothing was going the way we thought it should! It was one crisis after another, and I was wondering — is this ever going to stop!

Then, Summer just appeared, and I was thinking – Yea, now we can maybe get a bit of rest! But of course, with summer in the Flathead, you must take advantage of the time, because before you know it it will be fall (and guess what – it is!)!

Well, as everyone knows, we had a very busy Summer! We were blessed to be able to go on an Alaskan cruise – and just for the record, I recommend that everyone take one if they are able! The food was phenomenal, the service spectacular, and the company (Sherri) was absolutely wonderful! Then it was a whirlwind trip to Oklahoma to celebrate the 25th anniversary with Faith Lutheran Church in Durant, and to see the Grandkids there! It was really wonderful, even with the difficulties we encountered!

Then it was back here for VBS – which was great – Thanks to all those who put in so much time and effort!

And, finally, some breathing room – maybe????

Anyway, as I was going over what to talk about, I was recently reminded about the Amazing Grace of God, even when we don't see or feel it in our lives. I was reading in Isaiah the other day, and reminded just how much God does care for us!

Isaiah 43:1-3a - But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

Notice verse 2, Doesn't say "if," but "when" you pass through the waters! Storms in our life ARE going to happen! Remember, God never promised us a rose garden! In fact, Jesus told us the exact opposite!

Being a believer doesn't mean we will be kept from hard circumstances, but that He will be there with us, even if we don't feel it!

Remember, Daniel still faced the lions. Joseph was still thrown in prison. Job still lost all he held dear. The disciples still faced persecution.

Interestingly, when storms come, they are accompanied with a sort of darkness or at least a dreariness.

We may reach out our hand in the darkness searching for a guiding hand. And Notice what God says to His people in Isaiah 41:13 - For I am the LORD, your God, who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, Do not fear; I will help you.

A story is told of a tender-hearted surgeon who was walking through the large ward of a big hospital when he saw a little girl with her eyes bandaged, in total darkness and in destress waving her little hand back and forth as if trying to grasp someone's hand.

The surgeon went up to her and grasped that outreaching hand. Instantly there was a change of attitude and a release of stress. The little one was comforted and became restful and contented.

The surgeon did not remove the bandages nor did the darkness give way to light; all he did was grasp her hand while still in the darkness.

That child could represent any one of us today. You may be in a spiritual darkness with a sense of loneliness, darkness and desolation, yearning for the touch of a strong hand and the sound a strong unwavering stable voice that echoes and vibrates through you, "Fear not; I will help you." And again, the voice thunders, "Fear not, I have called you by your name."

Suddenly, the lightning flashes and in the darkness and you get a glimpse, but you can clearly see the image of a man with an outstretched hand beckoning you to take His hand. Then you realize He was there all the time waiting patiently. With your hand in His, with His strong right arm He draws you to His bosom, you fill the heartbeat and the tears of an undying love flowing down His cheeks and you ask the question, "Why Me Lord."

That question is a double edge sword. On the one hand, it seeks answers for the storms in our lives. Why do I have to endure this! What did I do to deserve this! Is this a punishment! – I could go on and on, but you get the picture!

But – then there is the other side of the sword. When we ask Why me Lord, we must think of the Lord as Redeemer, and it becomes - Why me Lord, what have I ever done, to deserve even one of the treasures I've known? I know that it's for others, but is it really for me Lord? Did you really forgive me, Lord??? But God Himself says: Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.

He called me! By Name! What a comfort in the dark and gloom!

So, what does it mean to be redeemed.

1st, it means that a cost was involved. I Corinthians 6:20, & 7:23 clarify how we were bought with a price. John 19:30 is where Jesus says to God "It is finished" which translates "paid in full"! Galatians 3:13 tells us that Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law having become a curse for us.

Peter says we were purchased – not with silver and gold, but with the precious blood of Christ!

Redeemed, means purchased with a price that we could not pay! And God has purchased us!

Next, redemption includes possession. Not just something owned, but prized above all else. Jesus demonstrated how much He values us when He died on the cross for you and for me!

The next thing this passage tells us is to not be afraid. That is a tall order! As we struggle through the storms around us we can't help but think of all the issues, problems, and things that are going wrong, and that makes us think about future problems that might come from this storm. We ask, will it ever end?

Even the Disciples had fear during the storms of their lives (Matt 14)! Noting that particular storm, Jesus walked out to the boat – remember that?, but He didn't do it till the fourth watch – sometime between 3-6 AM. The disciples left in the evening, so they fought the storm for quite a few hours before Jesus walked out to them. Does that mean He didn't care, or was just playing with them? Of course not – SEE REDEMPTION ABOVE!

God calls us by name and He wants us to remember His name. God will be with us as we face all of the things that threaten to consume us----things in nature, and even those who oppose us (Isaiah 43:2).

So, what do we do when faced with the fear of the storms around us? We Remember His Name! What that means, is we remember who He is, and what He has done to redeem us!

As a matter of fact - this entire scripture declares that He remembers me and I am not forgotten. He never forgets me! I am never lost in the crowd. He Knows My Name!

So, as we head into fall, remember The creator of the Universe, Knows you – and has called you – BY NAME!

VBS 2023 Keepers of the Kingdom

Huzzah! (That means "hooray!") is how we welcomed our VBS kids each day to Keepers of the Kingdom where they enter a world of castles and kings

and queens and dragons and epic battles!

We started off the week with 16 kids but ended the week strong with 30 kids hearing about the saving grace of Jesus.

Our Bible verse theme for the week was from Ephesians 6:10-17 ¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹ Put on the full armor of



God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. ¹² For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. ¹³ Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the



shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

We reminded the kids that the bible says to be strong "in the Lord," and to be "in the Lord," that they needed to be part of God's good kingdom and rely on God to help them be spiritually strong. He gives his children special spiritual armor to wear in the spiritual battles.

As we spent the week together learning about standing strong in God's truth, we also got the chance to meet a boy or girl living in a different part of the world. Our offerings each day were collected to go to the Children's Hunger Fund to help children who are living in poor conditions and don't have enough to eat. The kids heard that for just .25 cents, they could provide 1 meal and the best part is that each of them can help. "Alone, we can do so little; Together, we can do so much!" Not only do families receive much needed food, but they get to hear about Jesus, too!

The kids saw the realization that they have the ability to make a difference! We were able to send a check to the Children's Hunger Fund in the amount of \$280 which equates to providing 1,120 meals!

God provided the perfect team members. We are thankful for everyone for sharing their time, talents, and Jesus throughout the week.

Finally, we had the groundbreaking on October 13, 2019. Now almost four years to the day we will be celebrating the dedication of our new building on October 15, 2023, at the same time we celebrate the Fall Harvest Dinner! We may not have met the Five Year plan, but God has blessed us richly from start to finish! The contractors and subcontractors have been a joy to work with. As always thanks for your prayers and support, and a special thank you to the donors who have provided the financial resources that have brought us to this point!
